




Members of the Northern Alberta Development Council (NADC) met in Fort McMurray on June 8th and 9th, 2011.

Slave Lake Update

 On May 25th, the NADC sent Research Officer Steven Rowe to Slave Lake to assist residents returning to the area after the



devastating May 15th fire that consumed parts of the community. In particular, the NADC played a significant role in assessing the needs of returning businesses. NADC helped create a temporary job bank which provided job opportunities for residents who had lost their jobs due to the fire, and helped businesses fill vacant positions.

- Over 30 businesses registered with the NADC and in excess of 300 jobs were identified in Slave Lake. Currently, the NADC has transitioned the job bank to Alberta Employment and Immigration and continues to coordinate communications between contractors, job seekers, employers and local economic development units.
- The NADC will be following up initial assessments of Slave Lake businesses and will continue to play an integral role in coordinating efforts to rebuild the community.
- A special six month deferral will be offered for NADC bursary recipients affected by the Slave Lake and area wildfires. Contact the NADC at 780-624-6545 to discuss deferral options.

AWARDS, BURSARIES & SCHOLARSHIPS

- Alberta Education and NADC will be offering the Northern Student Teacher Bursary again this year. The deadline for applications will be October 15, 2011
- NADC has created a special bursary for individuals becoming Large Animal Veterinarians. They can now apply for a \$6,000 bursary in all four years of studies.
