Members of the Northern Alberta Development Council (NADC) met in Edmonton on November 15, 2012.

On November 15, 2012 the Northern Alberta Development Council met in Edmonton to discuss issues relevant to Northern Alberta. The meeting, facilitated by Vice-Chair Williard Strebchuk, addressed several administrative items and included presentations related to transportation, mental health and access to markets for northern goods.

Presentations:

A representative from Providing Assistance Counselling and Education (PACE) gave an overview of the organization to Council. PACE serves individuals and communities dealing with crisis and trauma in Northwest Alberta. This includes but is not limited to those dealing with sexual abuse, suicide and post traumatic stress disorder. The presentation highlighted the need for additional therapists trained to address all types of trauma, and the need for a coordinated and consistent approach to delivery of services. The General Manager of Red Arrow provided information on a new motor coach service connecting Alberta communities. A group of established and experienced Alberta bus companies have come together to provide residents with a new passenger bus network that includes new scheduled bus services and new routes to Alberta communities. <u>AlbertaBus.com</u>, an on-line booking centre, was unveiled in March 2012 to serve the transportation needs of both metropolitan and smaller Alberta centres. As new partnerships are established, the number of bus companies and routes serviced continues to increase. The Northwest Corridor Development Corporation gave an overview of their research report titled <u>Accessing the Corridor – Benefiting</u> from Northwest Alberta's Proximity to Canada's Shortest Route to the Asia Pacific which was partially funded by the NADC. The report provides statistics and information on how agriculture, forestry and energy related goods from northwestern Alberta are being moved to market.
